- In response to the Church's moral call for action, we seek to better understand the interconnectedness of all of God's creation and act in solidarity with vulnerable populations around the world and for future generations.



The environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.







Humanity needs a profound cultural renewal; it needs to rediscover those values which can serve as the solid basis for building a brighter future for all.


Our present crises – be they economic, food-related, environmental or social – are ultimately also moral crises, and all of them are interrelated.




